I was pleased to be able to attend the presentation by County & Borough officers of the proposed new footpath that will be installed on Braishfield Road from Jermyns Lane to the Dog & Crook Inn. The contract documents will be finalised in order for the scheme to go out to tender in the coming weeks. The County Council hope to get the contractor whoever is approved starting on site sometime in late September.

Dear Editor,

As the neighbours of Little Beeches, we received notice in January that a TPO had been placed on the existing five mature oak trees at the front of little beeches, this was apparently instigated by councillor Hatley.

We have recently received a copy of the confirmation order which puts a TPO on only four oaks, without having a

reference to which one is not covered (take your pick). The very next day we received a copy of the application to put two new four bedrooms house to the rear of the existing property. This proposal also requires the felling off one of the oaks covered in the original TPO. All message to councillor Hatley by our son have been ignored. We did manage to get in touch by phone but all he did was vacillate about how suddenly a tree once worth saving is not worth saving when a developer becomes involved.

A retired developer who we know , looking at little beeches is of the opinion that the oaks could well be the councils property, as they are between the original boundary fence and the highway , again councillor Hatley did not want to follow this line. The one thing he did achieve is we know now how not to waste our vote next time.

Braishfield Primary School



In light of the special events in Portsmouth and Normandy to commemorate the 75th anniversary of D Day, the children have been finding out what happened and why the invasion was such a significant turning point in the Second World War. I believe it is important for the children to learn about such historical events and the sacrifices made, particularly in light of the added local significance for us here on the South coast. As the numbers of surviving veterans dwindle, it is essential to ensure their stories are heard by future generations. I was really impressed to hear the children share their knowledge and reflect on how the allied troops must have felt on that day.

The older children were inspired to write, imagining themselves as a British soldier on board a landing craft as it approached the Normandy beaches. Here are a few powerful extracts from their writing:

'My mind is racing, I don't know what I'll see when I get on the beach. I can hear gunshot all around me and I think of my family.' **William M**

'CRASH! Heart thumping. Palms sweating. I slowly step onto the boat. Will I live? Or will I die? I can't bear leaving all my family behind, but of course I can't show it.' **Isabelle K**

'Ssssshhhhhhh....the waves of the English Channel swoosh around my ears like a yoyo being spun around on someone's finger. I can hear voices whispering.... "...tell my family that the box is theirs if I don't make it...."'

"TROOPS, as soon as we reach Normandy you will jump into the sea. Jeffords, you will go first" screamed the General. My hands are shaking. I'm bitterly cold. **Charlie G**

'I'm on a shaking boat, getting ready to approach the beach. I don't know where a single enemy is. I can't see anything other than the fog. I feel like I'm going to go down, or get shot straight away... I already miss my family and I bet they miss me too. I wish I could go home - but I am here to save my country!' **Isla T**

'Many gunshots in my ears. It was deafening. I prayed with all my heart but nothing happened. I am imagining myself in a world where there is peace, quiet and love. A bullet shot past my face like a venomous snake catching its prey. Barbed wire lines the shore.' **Molly M**






The weather was particularly kind to us and all that turned up had a great time. The food looked very good too.




