Dear Residents,

The County Council’s Transformation programme to 2021- Revenue Savings Proposals:

Over recent years Hampshire County Council has had cuts of £480 million so far and now needs to cut another £80 million.

This so far has caused a great deal of hurt to many residents. The assumption is that we are likely to see a well above inflation rise in Council Tax to about 4.99% and maybe the same the following year.

The District Councils will be required to shoulder costs that the HCC had on waste collection, and districts will no longer be refunded for recycling. Residents will be charged for dumping wood including fence panels, sheds, window frames etc at the waste tips and increased charges for some other household waste.

Therefore, I believe, sadly we can expect more fly tipping.

We all were told by government that austerity was over but clearly it is **not** and residents can expect to pay more.

REMEMBRANCE

Pilot Officer (74349) Derek Charles, RAF Volunteer Reserve in 1940 in WWII was commissioned in September 1939 after attending a flying course at RAF Cranwell, a 2 year course fitted into 4 months, and joined Bomber Command. On 15 August he was shot down while on a bombing raid over Germany and was killed near Dresden. He was buried in Durnbach Cemetery and a grave marked by a simple white stone cross identified with his service number. His two brother pilots were also killed, the remainder of crew were saved.

A letter of condolence was received by the family from His Majesty the King:

The Queen and I offer you our heartfelt sympathy in your great sorrow. We pray that your country's gratitude for a life so nobly given in its service may bring you some measure of consolation.

Signed: George R.I.

Derek made the supreme sacrifice: "All you had hoped for, all you had, you gave."

Acts of Remembrance

The Parish Council is pleased to report that repairs have been carried out to the War Memorial and include a disabled access for the laying of wreaths.

In addition, the Parish Council has agreed, following a request from Mrs Sylvia Rose, that a bench (donated by the Rose family) is positioned opposite the War Memorial in memory of Mrs Rose's late husband, Arthur and his brother Robert (whose name appears on the War Memorial). Hampshire Highways has agreed the positioning of The Rose Memorial Bench and this will be blessed by The Reverend Jane Thompson on Remembrance Sunday.

The Act of Remembrance will take place on **Sunday 10th November at 10.50am** at the War Memorial followed by a service at All Saints church. Following the service, refreshments will be served in the Church Room.

On **Monday 11th November at 10.50am**, there will be an Act of Remembrance with a wreath being laid at the War Memorial by the Braishfield Village Association.

May we request that drivers respect these Acts of Remembrance on both days and use alternative routes through the village.

HAVE SOME FUN – AND EXERCISE YOUR BRAIN

TABLE TENNIS

Abbey United Reformed Church, in association with ROMDAG, run drop in table tennis on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month. The session starts at 2pm and finishes at 4pm in the Abbey Hall, just down the road from the church by the arch.

The group was set up to provide a fun activity which is there for people living with dementia, and for their carers.

It provides an important opportunity for people living with dementia to continue with activities they enjoy or to try a new hobby. The group also offer the opportunity for carers to socialise with people who are in a similar situation. Research over the UK has shown table tennis is a great form of exercise for the brain health and it increases concentration and alertness.

So, why not pop along and join the group at this interesting and fun way to stave off the onset of dementia, and to help those with dementia as the combination of gentle exercise and plenty of socialising is the perfect mix. One of our participants said ‘I enjoy coming twice a month, it’s great fun. It doesn’t matter if I’m not good at it!’

One in six people aged 80 and over live with dementia; 80 per cent of those in care homes are living with a form of the condition. Exercise, and table tennis in particular, can have a positive impact on well-being and can help people live better with dementia. The beneficial physical effects for those living with dementia can include increased cerebral blood flow, better co-ordination and improved balance, which ultimately builds self-confidence and reduces falls.

The group providing a safe, friendly environment for regular exercise, and the opportunity to socialise, which in turn helps lift people’s mood. Come along to this friendly session, no experience necessary and everyone is very welcome to take part. The cost of the session is a £1 per person donation – included in this price is tea, coffee, fun and friendship!

“GRAND FUN” - Attention Grandparents!!

Whilst out walking his dog in the Memorial Park Revd Mike Perrott, the Minister at Abbey United Reformed Church, had noticed the significant number of grandparents at the park looking after grandchildren. He felt these families could benefit from a casual drop-in activity, to enjoy a cup of tea or coffee, a place their grandchildren could play and a chance to meet other grandparents.

Revd Mike took this idea forward and in September Abbey United Reformed Church will be celebrating the first birthday of Grand Fun – a venue specifically aimed at Grandparents and their Grandchildren. It is a very welcoming group where all are welcome to pop in with their pre-school grandchildren, have a cup of tea or coffee and chat while the children play with toys in a safe environment. Visitors are welcome to stay for a short time or the whole session There is no charge.

The grandparents who come regularly enjoy the informality of the group and enjoy talking to others in the same situation. One grandparent said, “This group has been of great benefit to my grandson. He has grown in confidence and mixes well with the other children”. This small, friendly group meet in the lounge of Abbey Hall in Romsey on **Tuesdays in term-time between 10.15am and 11.30am**. The hall can be found, conveniently, on the way towards Romsey War Memorial Park – why not pop in on the way to or from the play park?


SHEEP MATTER AT ELM GROVE

Celebrations at All Saints – the 'new look' Church Room is 10 years old!



Eleven years ago the Church Room was in a sorry state, with a large hole in the floor, a hole in the ceiling, a pervading smell of damp, no proper kitchen and one small toilet with a cold water only handbasin. But that was a step forward from the previous 10 years! Plans were afoot to remedy the situation, discussions and feasibility investigations resulting in much debate, which included the possibility of demolition, having begun in November 2000, when the PCC had voted that the Church

Room should be substantially improved and renovated. Fast forward to 2019 and we are accustomed to a warm, inviting, well lit space with an excellently equipped kitchen and good toilet facilities. What a joy!

Braishfield All Saints Church and Community Appeal was launched on 11th April 2003. Despite exceptionally hard work the committee were unable to attract any grant aiding for general building costs, but their encouragement of fund raising efforts was highly successful. In 2007 we had completed Phase One of our project when we re-ordered the church, raising the floor level at the back so that an easy access door could be placed in the south wall, and installing a sound system. Some pews were removed to allow more flexible space and the whole floor area up to the chancel step became wheel chair accessible. The vestry had been extended into the church because the 'Girl's Vestry' was now an entrance area and needed to be accommodated elsewhere. New cupboards were specially built for the back of the church, made from the pews which had been removed.

The project to re-order the church and refurbish the Church Room was a long time in the planning, and the whole village community was involved with the huge fund raising initiative which lasted for many years. Over £255,000 was needed to carry out all the work. Had it not been for the carpentry skills of Peter Quarendon, who rebuilt the vestry screen, and made and installed a number of high quality cupboards and other woodwork in both the church and Church Room, and for others who have given most generously of their time and skills, the final cost would have been much higher. That we now have a well ordered, well maintained church and a warm and welcoming Church Room is due to the amazing efforts of very many people over a long period of time, and we give thanks to God that all their work resulted in buildings which are used and appreciated by so many in the village community throughout the year.

To mark the 10th Anniversary of the completion of the All Saints Building Project when the Church Room was dedicated by the Bishop of Winchester on 1st November, All Saints Day, 2009, we invite everyone to look into the church and Church Room on **Saturday 2nd November between 10am and 4pm** to see displays about the work which was undertaken, and to find out more about the history of the Church Room, which Wendy Quarendon is continuing to research. Tea and coffee will be available throughout the day. And do join us at 11.00am on Sunday 3rd November when we meet in All Saints to praise God for his goodness and celebrate all that has been made possible over the last 10 years, because of the work that was carried out.

Farewell to our Rector – Canon Steve Pittis

It is eight years now since Steve Pittis was installed as Rector of the Braishfield Benefice in September 2011. Last month, August, Steve announced that he will be retiring from full-time ministry in mid-October this year: eight years seem to have passed very quickly. The All Saints community gathered at the evening service on Sunday 15th September, the last one he was scheduled to take in the village, to wish Steve and Teresa well as they move into retirement, and to thank them for all they have contributed during their time with us. In making the presentation of a cheque for £515, a 'Thank You' card signed by church members and a framed photograph of the church, churchwarden Andy Brooks spoke of the focus Steve has given us, reminding us that the church is people, not a building, and that our main purpose is to worship God and explore our faith, and then be involved with the wider community. Many initiatives have taken off during his time with us, with Messy Church and the Sparks Club at the village school just two of them. Andy thanked Steve for all that he has done in the benefice, helping us to work more closely as a team, and wished him and Teresa happiness in the next stage of their life. Steve and Teresa will be moving to live in Dibden Purlieu. In response Steve said that his main aim throughout his ministry in the benefice had been making the name of Jesus better known and encouraging people to grow deeper in their faith. He said it had been a privilege to be involved in ministry in the parish. Teresa was given a bouquet of flowers, and she thanked everyone for their friendship.

Many are asking what happens after Steve leaves. The churchwardens of the 5 parishes of the benefice, Awbridge, Braishfield, Farley Chamberlayne, Michelmersh and Timsbury have already met with the Archdeacon to initiate the process of finding and appointing a successor. There is a set procedure to be followed, with legal responsibilities, and the hope is that a new incumbent may be appointed by July 2020. Meanwhile we will continue to benefit from the ministry of the Revd Jane Thompson, the Self Supporting Minister (ie unpaid) who has been attached to our benefice for several years. The diocese will supply clergy to take the services which would normally have been undertaken by the Rector. The Rectory will be let after Steve and Teresa have moved out, until it is needed for the next incumbent.

This service is to remember loved ones who have passed away. Names will be read and candles will be lit during the service.



IRONMAN - 2.4 Mile Swim, 112 Mile Bike, 26.2 Mile Run...
A long distance triathlon with a time cap of 17 hours...
Do I dare to dream...

After the tenth time of opening up the Ironman Wales registration website I thought to myself; just do it, you obviously want to... so I did. I signed up and instantly thought what have I just done!

After being inspired by the Brownlee brothers in 2012, I signed up for my first triathlon in 2013 and simply fell in love with the sport. This opened up opportunities I never thought possible, representing Team GB in their age group teams in Geneva, Lisbon and Tartu. I loved it and by 2019 I find myself coming first overall female in the Brutal Middle Distance Tri, a 1.2 mile swim in a freezing cold lake, a 56 mile bike course in Snowdonia - HILLS!! and then a 13 mile run including an ascent and descent of Snowdon! Unbelievable and so unexpected! Could I love this sport anymore?!?

Yes - Tenby 2019! Just the most incredible and fascinating experience. I am petrified but so excited, a complete mixture of emotions stood ready to go on Tenby North beach, the weather is stunning, the Welsh national anthem starts to play, the crowd, the athletes, everyone is singing, it gives me goosebumps. Then the horns sound and we're off!!

The swim was incredible, I exit the water to the roar of the crowds, see my family bursting with pride and smiles, I run along the town to transition and my eyes well up because it is just so amazing, the atmosphere, the crowd and this is only the beginning! The bike gave you hills, hills and more hills! The route was hard but the crowds and support, which was 4 or 5 deep in places, made those climbs feel pan flat - well almost! I couldn't stop smiling this was just out of this world! Back into transition and out on the run, again the crowds - phenomenal! A hilly run high fiving the crowds, bursting with such positive energy, I should be shattered but I am having the time of my life!!

And then there it is, the illusive red carpet, lapping up all the high fives, the cheers and then hearing as I cross the line ... 'Leanne you are an Ironman!' No words can explain just how amazing that felt, only to turn round, bearing in mind I was paranoid about not making the cut off time of 17 hours and dreaming of a 15 hour finish time,

to see a time of 12 hours and 55 minutes!! Absolutely buzzing and completely overwhelmed!

If there is anything you want to do or want to try, no matter how big or small, get out there, work for it and enjoy it. Ironman taught me a lot, but the biggest thing it taught me is that... Anything is Possible!


