Parish Council

- Footpath 4 has been re-opened following the demolition of the barn.
- Responsibility for the highways (including footpaths) in Braishfield and for road safety lies with Hampshire County Council (HCC). This responsibility includes maintenance of highway verges; HCC also commonly cut back overgrowing hedges, but the responsibility for preventing hedges from obstructing roads and roadside pavements lies with the landowner on whose land the hedge is growing.
- The Council is applying to HCC to initially replace three stiles on two footpaths in the Parish. Two are at the northern end of Footpath 8, (Eldon Lane / Paynes Hay Road) and the third is at the junction of Footpaths 5 and 6 (Malthouse Farm). We will keep you updated regarding this.
- Sarah Hughes (Senior Neighbourhood Planning Officer) will be attending the Parish Council meeting in the Village Hall on the 5th October to answer any questions regarding a Neighbourhood Plan.
- The Council, working with HCC, is taking forward the concerns raised by parishioners re speeding in the village.

Braishfield Climate and Sustainability Group - Verge alongside the John Bevan Path

The president of the Royal Horticultural Society (the wonderfully named Keith Weed) has recently said: 'We are now painfully aware that we face a climate and biodiversity crisis, and that every effort counts'. The verge on the John Bevan path is Braishfield's small contribution to increasing biodiversity. In spring we planted 300 plug plants of native perennial wildflowers amongst the existing grass and 'weeds' on the verge. To allow the plants to establish the verge has not been cut except for a strip along by the road to allow for sight lines. This year the new plants have not had time to make their presence felt or seen in any quantity and the grass has predominated. As most of the plants should by now have set seed the verge is now due to be cut and the cuttings removed. We are hoping that by following this management regime the wildflowers will gradually establish and take over, providing food and habitat for birds, butterflies and

insects. Although at the moment it is not a thing of beauty it is a 'work in progress' and we need time to allow the wildflowers to do their thing. We thank all residents who care for the village and its environment for their patience in allowing us to do this.

Braishfield Pantry

As we settle into the 'new normal' in our home and work lives, the Pantry staff members are also enjoying returning to more 'normal' routines and good old-fashioned customer service. We're delighted to be able to use our lovely china cups and plates to serve drinks and cakes again, but we continue to offer our takeaway



service for those wishing to use single use containers. We appreciate your support in continuing to wear masks whenever possible during your visits to the shop. Our staff and volunteers have agreed to wear masks also. Perhaps this simple measure, along with the use of plenty of hand sanitiser, will help all of us to stay safe as we move forward out of lockdown?

Several of the Pantry volunteers, along with Sharon, are taking up the great opportunity to complete a first aid course that is to be run in October by Roy Bayntun, one of our brilliant local First Responders. Roy's 2 half day sessions will give a good basic understanding of all things first aid related, including the use of defibrillators; responding to allergic reactions and the use of EpiPens in cases of anaphylaxis.

The course will build on the Pantry staff's own preparations and refresher training for the introduction of 'Natasha's Law' which takes effect in England from 1st October 2021. This legislation follows on from lessons learned after the tragic deaths of people who suffered severe allergic reactions in recent years after eating certain foods. Food business operators must be ready to share full information about ingredients and the 14 main allergens in their food products. Braishfield Pantry is already holding ingredient information for homemade products, so is well ahead, and we would encourage anyone who might have concerns to talk to volunteers and we can give you the relevant folders in order for you to make an informed decision.

As we all return to a little more to our 'normal' life, please do remember that we are always pleased to see you here at the Braishfield Pantry. We

still stock those everyday needs, such as a pint of milk or a loaf of bread as well as packs of stamps, but we also have those lovely treats that help to cheer us up every so often. That reminds me - I can't quite believe it as I am writing this, but at the next update we will be really gearing up for Christmas! So, watch this space for news!

SHEEP MATTER AT ELM GROVE

Life seems kind of quiet for us mere observers, but there is still plenty for Kate to do. The ewes are being prepared to spend time in the field with their rams and so the whole cycle will start again. WINCHESTER CATHEDRAL – 'RESONANCE' – A FESTIVAL OF FLOWERS

Over 300 flower arrangers from Flower Clubs across the Wessex and Jersey Area of NAFAS came together in Winchester Cathedral for 'Resonance' a Festival of Flowers, about how memories are triggered by our senses. The designs were all thoughtful and reflective of the losses and sacrifices so many have made following the pandemic.

The build-up and planning started over two years ago. It was a very stressful time for the designer Pip Bensley with all the problems and restrictions associated with Covid. It was also a challenge for the flower arrangers as all the arrangements were to be eco-friendly by not using any Oasis foam.






