It's been a rather hectic but exciting few months as I settle into the role of your new borough councillor. Once again, thank you for your support and encouragement - it is a huge honour to represent our wonderful community and village. From parish councillors, to borough councillors, to county councillors, it might seem confusing as to who does what, but Test Valley Borough Council is responsible for community and leisure, environmental services, housing and environmental health, planning and building, property and asset management, and planning policy and economic development.

In April of this year, following approval at Council, TVBC has now shared its new Corporate Plan for 2023-2027 Corporate Plan 2023-2027 | Test Valley Borough Council. The final format of the plan was officially launched in June. It focuses on five main priorities:

- Prosperity creating economic growth that impacts positively on our communities.

News from the Local Hospice



Many of you might have seen the report about the hospice on BBC South recently which highlighted the important work we do. We thought you might like some more detail on your local hospice which not only covers Andover and Braishfield, but Romsey, Whitchurch, Sutton Scotney and the many surrounding villages.

At the heart of our services lies the exceptional new hospice building, with ten rooms for patients requiring expert palliative care. Ensuite rooms with state-of-theart beds which expand to a double for partners and families to snuggle together, and access to a patio and beautiful gardens.

In addition, we care for over 160 patients in the community. The Community Palliative Care Team is a beacon of hope and guidance for these individuals and their families, providing invaluable symptom control, emotional support and coordination of all aspects of care. Our dedicated Home Care Team can respond quickly to deliver personalised care directly to individuals in their own homes.

Overnight, a team of qualified clinicians provide a Hospice at Home service. Many concerns can be dealt with over the phone, but nurses can attend emergency calls and visit patients experiencing severe symptoms if needed.

Self-caring individuals with a life-limiting condition but a long-term prognosis benefit greatly from our Day Centre where up to 3 times a week a programme offers arts and crafts, well-being and therapy, cooking and baking, quizzes and games.

We are grateful that many of you have contributed generously to support the Countess of Brecknock Hospice in Andover. Through your gifts, we can maintain the high standards that have earned us an outstanding CQC rating and a gold accreditation within the Hampshire Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust. Thank you.

Braishfield Horticultural Society

This summer our members enjoyed three garden visits. Our first visit was on a lovely spring afternoon towards the end of April to Lepe House. Lepe House is part of the Lepe Estate and is situated at the mouth of the



Beaulieu River. The estate includes properties, extensive gardens, grazing lands and a privately owned beach.

The gardens consist of 14 acres of a landscaped spring woodland garden originally planted in 1893 and consists of camellias, mature magnolias and rhododendron, also a walled garden, ponds and spring bulbs. The coastal walk overlooks the Solent. This was the embarkation point for D-Day.

Our second visit was to Twin Oaks, Chandlers Ford, this garden is still being developed. A suburban garden with plenty of colour from azaleas and rhododendrons, perennials and bulbs. The lawns meander around informal beds with a stream with bridges leading from one area to another. Seating around the garden with mirrors giving an impression of depth. There was even an Aviary with birds and several guinea pigs

Our third visit was to Wingham Barn Cottage, Ampfield. This is a Forest Garden and a completely new concept for most members. Ruth and Jon aim to grow most of their own food whilst also creating diverse habitats to attract wildlife. A silage clamp has been repurposed to become a walled garden complete with polytunnel, green house and raised bed. They have planted over 200 native trees, a new hedge and numerous fruit trees and a number of ponds have been dug. Part of the former grazing meadow is now a young forest garden. The aim is to mimic a young open forest with the purpose of producing food in a way that is both sustainable and low maintenance. Each evening ended with a meal in one of the local public houses. If you would like to join us next year or there is a garden you would like to visit please let us know.

The year is rolling on, the children have broken up for their summer break, our farmers are keeping a close eye on the weather as the crops ripen and maybe, for some of us at least, the pace of things slows down a bit. Maybe we have a bit of time to catch our breath and look around us. And that is no bad thing.

Our Sunday readings recently have been taken from Matthew 13 and this chapter

contains many of the parables that Jesus told us. The parables of the sower, the weeds, the hidden treasure, the net, the mustard seed and the yeast. These stories are timeless, easily retellable, things that makes us ask questions of ourselves. Jesus often taught using parables because he knew that we engage and remember more from a story than we do a lecture. How many of us can remember far more about our favourite film than we can about our physics O level? Why is it that I can remember all the words to the title sequence of 'Champion the Wonder Horse' and nothing of the Periodic Table?

Stories are important, they are a great way of passing information down through the generations. I can recount tales about my great grandparents because their stories are told and retold with great affection. Those stories are family treasures and important to hold on to.

So if you are fortunate enough to have a little time to take stock this summer, why not think about your family stories and perhaps think about the story of your life, its ups, downs, challenges and joys? Whatever your stories are, treasure them and make sure that they are passed along to the next generation.

Before I sign off, I would like to thank everyone for your support for my trip to the Arctic Circle, I covered over 6000 miles with only one breakdown, met lots of lovely folk, saw too many reindeer to count and together we raised over £4900 (with gift aid) for Prostate Cancer UK. So thank you all again and have a lovely summer.


